Dear Fellow Cursillistas,

FIRST THINGS FIRST

“We must bear in mind that Group Reunions are not held so that there may be people to attend the Cursillos, but the Cursillos are held so that there may be people to make a Group Reunion.” Eduardo Bonin

This important statement is quoted in the Total Security rollo on the Cursillo weekend. I believe that it is a good idea to remind us of the importance of this truth.

There should be no doubt in our minds about the importance of our weekly Group Reunion. It gives us the regular opportunity to review our spirituality in light of our baptismal calling. It encourages us to continue to pursue deeper knowledge of the faith. And, for me, without the weekly reunion, my evangelization of environments would fail if not for my group encouraging me (or embarrassing me!) to fulfill my evangelization plans.

In my experience, we develop deep and lasting friendships with our weekly group members. There is nowhere else where we can have such bonds of fellowship and mutual love on our Christian walk.

Yet so many cursillistas see the Group Reunions as unnecessary. They are full of excuses for not grouping—I don’t have the time; there is no group in my parish; the other groups in my area get together on an inconvenient day of the week, or time of the day.

Do you know anyone who calls themselves Catholic but never attends Sunday mass? Would you consider them to be good Catholics? In the same way, anyone who does not attend a weekly Group Reunion should not consider themselves a practicing cursillista.

Eduardo Bonin knew, as we know, that the Group Reunion is absolutely critical if we are to live the Cursillo method. So if you are not grouping, you need to start, yesterday! Go to your local ultreya and find out where and when other people are grouping. Find a cursillista in your parish and start your own group. Stop making excuses, and make it happen! Remember, Christ is counting on you! (And so is Cursillo!)

*Pilgrim's Guide to be Updated**

Beginning January 1, 2017, we will be using an updated version of the *Pilgrim's Guide*. In the past, the US Cursillo took the liberty of providing additional prayers in the *Pilgrim's Guide*. These prayers included a short version of the Liturgy of the Hours, the Canticle of Zechariah, Canticle of Mary, Canticle of Simeon, Prayer of the Cursillistas, Consecration of Cursillo to Mary, Star of Evangelization, etc. These prayers were added with good intentions and eventually became the norm but other prayers that were in the original *Pilgrim's Guide* were either lost or removed. The National Secretariat began studying the Charism of the Cursillo Movement in 2003. In this study, they looked back to the origins of the Movement in making their decision, that is, the foundational ideas that were given to our founder, Eduardo Bonnín. National Cursillo is not trying to inconvenience anyone by the publishing of a new version but asks us to prayerfully work with the Knoxville Cursillo Movement in its transition. No longer, for example, will the Holy Spirit prayer be on page 5; it has moved to page 129. Copies of the “new” *Pilgrim's Guide* will be available in English and Spanish at the Grand Ultreya/English Reunion of the Groups on Saturday, December 3, at St. Thomas in Lenoir City for \$5.00. We plan to have copies also available at the 4th day workshops and in the future at the Ultreyas.

*Excerpts from National Cursillo's letter to the Cursillistas dated February 15, 2016

Secretariat Positions

Spanish PreCursillo: The Pre-Cursillo Representative shall study and propose to the Secretariat the plan of establishment of an extension of the Cursillo Movement in the diocese. He/She will process all Cursillo weekend applications, screen for eligibility, and communicate all information concerning the up-coming weekend to the candidates and the rector/rectora. Also works with sponsors to communicate their role in the Cursillo process.

Music Representative: for English and Spanish

Database Coordinator (Assistant to the Secretariat)

Coordinator Spanish Palanca (Assistant to the Secretariat)

POSITIONS UP IN DECEMBER 2016

Lay Director: Prepares agendas for and runs Secretariat meetings. He/she does everything possible to promote a spirit of unity among Secretariat members, School of Leaders, and throughout the whole diocesan Cursillo Movement. Prepares an annual report.

English Pre-Cursillo: The Pre-Cursillo Representative shall study and propose to the Secretariat the plan of establishment of an extension of the Cursillo Movement in the diocese. He/She will process all Cursillo weekend applications, screen for eligibility, and communicate all information concerning the up-coming weekend to the candidates and the rector/rectora. Also works with sponsors to communicate their role in the Cursillo process.

English Cursillo: The Cursillo Representative shall present to the Secretariat names of prospective coordinators and help all leaders to carry out all that is required on the 3 -Day Cursillo according to the official literature. He/she will preside and coordinate the Clausura of the Cursillo weekend. He/she will be responsible for getting the new Cursillista names, addresses, and email addresses from the Rector/Rectora of the Cursillo Weekends (the Roster) and give to the Cursillo Secretariat Secretary to be placed in the archives and mailing list.

4th Day Workshop English: Develops technical talks based on the Secretariat's directive for topics; Sets up location for 4th Day Workshop for coming year; writes articles for *The Rooster Crows*; attends Secretariat meetings; provides background documentation to speakers, if needed; prepares agenda for workshop; purchases supplies for workshop; prior to workshop, verifies that location and date is on parish calendar; obtains key from Kay Sheldon; working with the Database Administrator, drafts and mails a flyer to membership re date, place and theme; acts as Master of Ceremonies at Workshop; keeps Cursillistas on time; drafts and mails "Thank you" notes to speakers and Pastor of parish; drafts Report and emails to the Secretariat members; updates attendance records and emails copy of attendance to Cursillo Director.

Spanish Post Cursillo: The Post Cursillo Representative shall, for the benefit of all Cursillistas, promote the essential means of perseverance (group reunion and Ultreya) and establish fundamental standards for managing the same according to the official literature. Working with the Secretary, will publish or distribute pertinent material for the information and orientation of the Cursillistas. He/She will gather the necessary statistical data to supply for the Secretariat opportune information concerning the progress of the Movement in the diocese with particular reference to the environments to be evangelized.

Webmaster (Assistant to the Secretariat)
