DID YOU KNOW?

The Tuesday before Lent goes by many different names. It has been called Fat Tuesday (in French, Mardi Gras). This refers to the practice of eating rich, fatty foods, as a last chance before the penitential practices of Lent. It is celebrated in Brazil and other countries as Carnival.

In some countries, it is known as Pancake Tuesday, as it is traditional to eat pancakes on that day.

It is also called Shrove Tuesday, from the English word shrive, meaning to obtain absolution and forgiveness for one's sins; it is a custom for a Christian to be shriven at the beginning of Lent.

On that day in Iceland, people eat salted meat and peas. In Lithuania, they eat doughnuts. In Finland, they eat green pea soup. In Poland, they celebrate Fat Thursday the week before, and have food-eating contests!

The Deacon's Two Cents



LET'S ALL BE GREAT SPONSORS By Deacon Bill Jacobs

The Cursillo experience has changed so many lives in the past 60 years. Each of us had a profound encounter with the Lord on our weekend, and we have discovered a way of living that brings joy and meaning to our lives.

So, it is only natural that we want others to experience the same thing! Whether we have just made a weekend, or we are "seasoned" cursillistas, we have a great desire to sponsor others in our family, or our parish, to make a Cursillo.

But, maybe, you are like me. At times, I have taken too lightly my understanding of, and commitment to, what it means to be a sponsor. If we sponsor someone poorly, it is less likely that the candidate will persevere in their Fourth Day. It is an awesome responsibility, so let's do it right!

The Leader's Manual spells out several criteria for being a good sponsor. These include:

- *Know, at least in its general outline, the goal of the Cursillo.* Just having made a weekend is not good enough. We have to understand what we're talking about!
- Know the candidate as well as possible and pray for direction from the Holy Spirit: Speak to God about the candidate, before you speak to the candidate about God. (Not, "Hi there. What's your name? Want to make a Cursillo?")
- Spark the desire for God and make it grow. Promote an attitude of conversion. Sounds a lot like evangelization in general.
- Take responsibility for the perseverance of the candidate until he or she is fully incorporated into his or her own Christian community. Our sponsorship duties do not end with the Clausura, but must extend forward after that, maybe for a year or more.

Many of us in our diocesan movement feel as though we are at the beginning of a resurgence in our movement. We can all be a part of that by sponsoring dynamic Christian leaders to make a weekend. I pray that each of you will be a part of that by being an awesome Cursillo sponsor!
